On 07/06/24, my Twitter/X account (@commonpace) displayed an unauthorized verification checkmark that I did not purchase, request, or consent to. This appears to be a violation of:

Twitter's Terms of Service (misrepresentation of account status).

Federal Trade Commission (FTC) Act, Section 5 (deceptive/unfair practices).

Computer Fraud and Abuse Act (CFAA) (unauthorized account modification).

2. Demand for Transparency

I formally request the following within 14 days:

Explanation: A detailed, written account of why my account was verified without my consent.

Employee/System Logs: The internal case number, employee name (if applicable), and documented reason (e.g., "system error," "test," "mistake").

Policy Violation: A copy of the policy that permitted this action—or confirmation that none exists.

3. Legal Rights & Next Steps

Failure to comply will result in:

A formal FTC complaint (File No. [###], if submitted).

A preservation demand for all relevant data (emails, Slack logs, system records).

Exploration of legal remedies under the CFAA and other applicable laws.
